## Bachelor of Arts in Pastoral Ministry

This program is designed to provide students with a breadth of knowledge in the liberal arts and Catholic culture and offer a solid foundation in biblical and theological studies in preparation for ministry

Students will develop language proficiency for ministry in a bilingual (English and Spanish) pastoral setting, and for English-language graduate studies. They will develop leadership skills and intercultural competencies needed for effective pastoral ministry in today's multicultural dioceses, parishes and institutions.

The program can be completed with a concentration in Philosophy, Catechesis or Pastoral Leadership. Students choosing the Philosophy concentration will fulfill requirements of the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops (USCCB) for seminarians at the college and pre-theology levels.

Graduates of this program will be prepared to work in a variety of ministerial situations which will contribute to the development of the Catholic Church in Spanish-speaking communities.

## Master of Arts in Pastoral Ministry

This program is designed for students who already have a BA degree (not necessarily in theology) and are interested in further training for ministry. Students will complete 36 credits, including courses in Scripture, Theology, and Ministry and conclude by writing a final pastoral project with a faculty mentor.

Students should have 12 credit hours of undergraduate theology or religious studies before beginning the program. Students who need to complete these prerequisites may apply and be admitted conditionally while they take BA-level classes.

Our partnership means that courses will be offered in both English and Spanish, allowing students to complete the degree in their primary language while developing the skills and fluency necessary for intercultural ministry.
